Comments:

The check in reflection and conversation was a worthy addition to the beginning of worship. 19 6 5  The check in reflection and conversation was a total interruption to the beginning of worship.

Comments:

The reflection and conversation taught me little about the connection of faith and life.  5 8 15 The exercise taught me a great deal about the connection of faith and life.

Comments:

We should do something like this on a regular basis. 8 16   Please, never do this again.

Comments:

If we don't have intentional reflection and conversation like this, we diminish the impact worship can have on our lives. 14 9 4  The connection between faith and daily life will happen without such reflection and conversation.

Comments:

The reflection and conversation did not significantly increase my awareness of what we say, sing, and pray in worship.   13 10 I am much more aware of what we say, sing, and pray in worship and what it means for my daily life.

Comments:

After participating in this experiment, it is easier for me to connect faith with my daily life. 10 11 1 5  Even after participating in this experiment, I still have a hard time connecting faith with my daily life.

Comments:

While the number of responses was fairly small (29), they represent nearly half of the average worship attendees.
